Dear Administrator Brooks-LaSure,

The National Hispanic Medical Association (NHMA) appreciates the opportunity to respond to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services' request for information on the Medicare Advantage program. As an organization dedicated to representing the interests of more than 50,000 licensed Hispanic physicians, we strongly urge you to protect and strengthen the Medicare Advantage program, which serves as a vital form of coverage for many of our members' patients.

Medicare Advantage plays an important role in expanding access to quality care among Hispanic seniors across the country. These plans offer comprehensive services like vision, dental and hearing that go beyond what traditional Medicare covers, which is important to our members who are focused on ensuring their patients are receiving coordinated and clinically appropriate care. We strongly believe Medicare Advantage is a valuable pathway to advance health equity – a priority for our organization. More than half of Hispanic Medicare beneficiaries choose Medicare Advantage over Medicare Fee-for-Service (FFS).¹ That's because these plans offer a better value for higher quality care. Black and Latino Medicare Advantage beneficiaries save an average of \$1,270 and \$1,113 per year, respectively, as compared to Medicare (FFS).² Black and Hispanic seniors enrolled in Medicare Advantage are more likely to report receiving routine health care services, including mammograms, flu shots, blood pressure screenings, and cholesterol checks, compared to their peers enrolled in FFS.³

As CMS continues to focus on advancing health equity and addressing social determinants of health, we hope you consider Medicare Advantage as critical to achieving those goals, as these plans focus on both the medical and social needs of its beneficiaries. For example, Medicare Advantage beneficiaries have access to meals and nutrition services, as well as support for affordable housing in addition to medical care.
