Outcomes

- · Medicare Advantage beneficiaries with certain chronic conditions, including diabetes, hyperlipidemia, and hypertension, have lower rates of inpatient utilization and emergency room visits compared to Fee-for-Service beneficiaries
- Medicare Advantage beneficiaries with prediabetes who develop type 2 diabetes are diagnosed nearly 5 months earlier on average than similar Fee-for-Service beneficiaries
- Medicare Advantage beneficiaries with chronic diabetes are more likely than Fee-for-Service beneficiaries to receive preventative care

95% of beneficiaries report being satisfied with their health care quality.
